* Instead of BUS 109, freshmen can choose to take Calculus 1. Note that, as with any cross-program registration, this is subject to the approval of the respective program chairs and seat availability.

** The communication course BUS 177, comprising "BAB Core Fundamentals," must be taken starting from the second year of studies, but seat availability will determine when exactly a BAB student takes the course. In case a seat is not available in a particular semester, the student is advised to complete another degree requirement in consultation with the BAB or GenEd academic advisor, taking a course with available seats.

Note 1: AUA undergraduate students must also take the following non-credit, Pass/No Pass courses: FND 110 Physical Education; FND 152 First Aid; FND 153 Civil Defense. The four required Physical Education courses should be completed in students' first two years. First Aid and Civil Defense should be completed during the freshman fall semester.

Note 2: General Education course clusters could be formed in an order preferred by an individual student.
